



2011 Red Bordeaux From The Bottle

An inconsistent drinker's vintage that offers immediate appeal. Readers should refer to [Issue 200](#) of The Wine Advocate, dated April 30, 2012, for my barrel tasting reviews of the 2011 Bordeaux vintage. In general, the bottled wines performed as well as if not slightly better than they did from barrel. Of course, some under-performed and others over-performed in this recent tasting. Unless otherwise noted, all of the following wines were tasted in bottle in late March and early April, 2014.

<p>One of the most dramatic chateaux in St.-Emilion, Pressac is well-worth a visit, not only for the touristic aspects, but for the quality of their wine, which continues to go from strength to strength. Copious notes of soft berry fruit, underbrush and camphor are present in this dark plum/ruby-colored, silky smooth, medium-bodied, attractive wine. While not the most complex 2011 I tasted, it will offer satisfying drinking over the next 7-10 years.</p>
